Types of Hardship Benefits

Medical expenses for myself, my spouse, my child or dependent

- Provide the itemized medical bills (dated in the last 30 days) showing the amounts due and unpaid after insurance
- If the expense is for my child or dependent, provide the front and back of your most recent Federal 1040 income tax form

Purchase of my principal residence which must be a permanent structure attached to land

- Provide the itemized purchase agreement signed by both parties
- Provide the itemized invoice showing the amounts due at closing and the financing

Tuition and related education expenses for post-secondary education for myself, my spouse, my child or dependent

- Provide the itemized invoice from the educational entity (dated in the last 30 days) which covers the next educational period including any room and board, if applicable
- If the expense is for my child or dependent, provide the front and back of your most recent Federal 1040 income tax form

Imminent mortgage or tax foreclosure of my primary residence or imminent eviction by your landlord

- Provide the mortgage or tax foreclosure notice on company letterhead showing the amounts due
- If you are renting, provide a copy of your lease and the eviction notice from your landlord showing the amounts due

Funeral expenses for my spouse, my child, my parent or dependent

- Provide the itemized invoice from the funeral home or cemetery showing the amounts due
- Provide a copy of the death certificate
- If the expense is for my child or dependent, provide the front and back of your most recent Federal 1040 income tax form

Repair damage to my principal residence as a result of a governmentally declared disaster

• Provide the intemized contract, signed by both parties, from the contractor that will repair the damage
